



## PUBLICATIONS

The Centre for Asian Affairs regularly publishes analysis and comments:

### **CAA MONITORS**

Monitors is a wide-ranging review of political, economic, and social events taking place in the countries of East Asia, accompanied by comments from the Centre's specialists. The centre publishes five monthly monitors: China Monitor, Japan Monitor, Korea Monitor, ASEAN Monitor and China in the UN. These monthly studies contain a compendium of current events, with particular emphasis on the activity of Asian countries in the region of Central and Eastern Europe.

### CAA BLOG/FOCUS

BLOG/FOCUS is **a brief analysis** of political and economic events which is published on an ongoing basis by the employees of the Centre for Asian Affairs of the University of Lodz in the form of blog comments and brief in-focus entries. **The CAA Blog** discusses the internal political situation and foreign policy of China, Japan and Korea. **The Focus CAA** series, on the other hand, focuses on short comments on the activities of China, Japan and South Korea in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, the Western Balkans and their policy towards ASEAN.



### **REPORTS**

The team at the Centre for Asian Affairs prepares reports and studies commissioned by central and local government authorities and business environment institutions. We have prepared reports commissioned by the Łódź Special Economic Zone, the Office of the Marshal of the Łódź Voivodeship, and reports with the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland and the KGHM Polska Miedź Foundation. The topics of the reports included the issue of investments in photovoltaic energy, promotion of agricultural products of the Łódź Voivodeship in China, and political and economic relations between China and Central European countries from local and central perspectives.

### COMMENTARY

In English, we publish commentaries on current political and economic events related to the domestic and foreign policies of China, Japan, South Korea, and ASEAN countries. These short-form opinions are intended to **present the opinions of the experts** of the Centre for Asian Affairs to a wider audience on an international scale.

### **CAA PAPERS**

The Centre for Asian Affairs Papers (CAA Papers) are **current analyses of developments in Asia**. These studies mainly concern the internal politics in China and Japan as well as the foreign activity of both countries, including their regional impact. In addition, we bring our readers closer to the dynamics of the situation on the Korean Peninsula, as well as the escalating Sino-American rivalry in Southeast Asia. In CAA Papers, we present a wide range of different ideas and views, providing an excellent platform for exploring new processes taking place in the East Asian region.

### **CAA BRIEFS**

The Centre for Asian Affairs Brief (CAA Brief) is an English-language publication that aims to provide **a short and accessible presentation of contemporary changes and processes** as well as international interactions taking place in the East and South-East Asia region. The CAA Brief series also includes analyses of Asian countries' domestic policies and their implications for the situation in the region. These publications are also a form of recommendations for central and local authorities as well as the European Commission.

### **PODCASTS AND DEBATES**



The "Asian Debates of the University of Lodz" project was created in response to the growing demand for knowledge and the public debate on **the role of Asia in international relations**. This project aims to become a permanent part of the scope of social responsibility of science and the dissemination of scientific research. The project provides for the recording of scientific debates and podcasts. The topics are based on research carried out by experts from Poland and abroad. The form of dissemination of research online is both a platform for scientists to exchange views (debates) and present research results (podcasts), as well as a modern form of enabling a wider audience to access knowledge in the field of social sciences.

## **PROJECTS**

The Centre for Asian Affairs carries out research projects related to Asia:



The National Science Centre (NSC) OPUS 9 grant

The research project, "Ideas and Identities in Chinese Foreign Policy, presents the evolution and changes taking place in the Central State/China in relation to ideological discussions shaping China's international identity. The main goal of the project is to create a model based on constructivist considerations based on the three main identity matrices of China in foreign policy: statehood, Marxism-Leninism, and culture.

### **LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN PRC**

**NSC OPUS13 grant** 

The research project, "The Roles of Local Authorities in China's Foreign Policy", analyzes the evolution of the role of local authorities in China's foreign policy during the post-1978 reform and opening up period. The economization of Chinese foreign policy and the increase in interaction with the outside world resulted in increased competition and rivalry between Chinese regions, with the central authorities having to react dynamically to the needs of local entities in external policy. The project assumes that as the external interaction of local actors increased, so did their internal influence, which led to the need to centralize their tasks in China's foreign policy under the Belt and Road Initiative.

### CHINA IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

**NSC OPUS17 grant** 

The research project, "The Belt and Road Initiative in Developing Countries: The People's Republic of China as a Multilateral and Normative Power", is a response to extensive discussions on China's growing role in international relations. Based on the analysis conducted by a research team in Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America, the project presents Chinese multilateral mechanisms and normative influence in the context of the following formats: ASEAN+1, 16+1 (China-Central and Eastern European cooperation format), China-Central Europe Cooperation Forum Africa (FOCAC) and the China-Latin America and Caribbean Forum (China-CELAC).



### CHINESE MULTILATERALISM IN PRC-US RELATIONS

support from the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange

The aim of the research is to identify the premises of the foreign policy of the People's Republic of China towards the countries of Central and Eastern Europe under the 16+1 cooperation mechanism, with particular emphasis on Sino-American interactions. The research focuses on the following issues: to what extent is China's policy in Southern Europe part of China's policy towards the US; how can the two powers cooperate in the wider area of South-North transport corridors in Central and Eastern Europe; what are the main motivations of Central and Eastern European countries in cooperation with China? The project is carried out in cooperation with the Sigur Center for Asian Studies, Elliott School of International Affairs, and George Washington University.



### PRC-USA IN THE ERA OF COVID-19

**Univeristy of Lodz grant** 

The project, "Political and economic interactions of the People's Republic of China with the United States in the era of COVID-19", aims to identify and analyze challenges for the liberal global order and the impact of the pandemic on the ongoing changes in the global balance of power. The aim of the project is to create a map of interactions between China and the United States, which have a decisive influence on the redefinition of the international system. The starting point of the project is the analysis of building competitive advantages of the People's Republic of China, which is based on the development of new technologies in the era of the "fourth industrial revolution".

### CHINESE DIPLOMACY TOWARDS SOUTHEAST ASIA

The Faculty of International and Political Studies of the University of Lodz grant

The research project focuses on the changes in Chinese foreign policy towards Southeast Asia since Xi Jinping took power in 2012. The aim of the project is to investigate how China uses the patron-client concept in peripheral diplomacy towards countries involved in territorial disputes in the South China Sea. The project is carried out in cooperation with the S.Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS) research center in Singapore.



#### **CHINA IN CEE AND 16+1**

### Financing from the KGHM Polska Miedź Foundation

The aim of the research project, "Economic and political activity of the People's Republic of China in the region of Central and Eastern Europe", is to explain the role of the Chinese 16+1 multilateral mechanism in the CEE region and to determine its effectiveness. For this purpose, the declarative sphere of the format was subjected to a detailed analysis, interpreting the official communiqués published after the summits of the heads of government of the countries involved in the aforementioned mechanism of cooperation.

### **LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN 16+1 FORMAT**

### Support from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland

The research project, "Interactions of local authorities in the 16+1 format", analyzes how local administration is used by the central government of the People's Republic of China for international activities, with particular emphasis on the countries from the 16+1 format. Firstly, the activities of Chinese local authorities in the international arena were discussed. Then they were compared with the activity within the 16+1 format, where all messages issued by leaders after the format's summits were subjected to a qualitative analysis in terms of references to interactions between local authorities.


